Clinical-Research Psychologist, Eating Disorders Program (EDP), Douglas University Institute in Mental Health

The Eating Disorders Program (EDP) at the Douglas University Institute offers comprehensive, ultra-specialized treatments for adults with eating disorders in the Anorexia or Bulimia Nervosa spectrum. The EDP is nationally and internationally recognized for its clinical services, research and teaching. The program also serves as a regional Eating Disorders Information Centre.

The EDP is presently seeking to fill a **permanent, full-time position** for a **Clinical-Research Psychologist**, with possible adjunctive academic appointment in the **Psychiatry Department at McGill University**.

Clinical Care: The Psychologist contributes to specialized psychotherapeutic activities in several spheres of program activity (including outpatient, day program and day hospital services). He/she performs clinical evaluations, offers individual, group and family/couple therapy, and also assumes responsibility for aspects of clinical programming.

Clinical Research: The Psychologist contributes to an ongoing program of clinical research and program evaluation, collaborates on existing projects, and also develops his/her own research. This psychologist is expected to obtain research grants and publish new findings.

Clinical Teaching: The Psychologist supervises psychology interns, and also contributes to a knowledge-transfer training program aimed at supporting the work of community clinicians working in non-specialized settings. There are additional teaching opportunities through McGill University, and other local universities with which the ED program is affiliated.

Given the linguistic character of Quebec society, bilingualism in French and English is necessary. A PhD in Psychology or a related field is required and the applicant must be license-eligible in the Province of Quebec, Canada.
