We are searching for a candidate with a doctoral degree in school psychology or a related discipline who shows strong professional identity as a school psychologist, evidence of scholarly productivity, development of a coherent program of research consistent with a research-intensive university, and a record of successful teaching. Experience as a practicing school psychologist is desirable. Eligibility and commitment to achieving license in Quebec are critical. Salary will be negotiable, according to qualifications and experience.
