- Registration for autonomous practice of psychology by the provincial registering/licensing body in the province of Ontario
- Experience in the provision of psychological services (including mental health services), such as assessment, counselling or other psychological services with adults, either to groups or individuals;

General information:

CSC offers a comprehensive benefits package that includes an indexed pension plan, a health care plan, an employer-paid dental plan, a disability insurance plan and generous leave benefits. Doctoral level registered psychologists can earn up to \$ 96,826.00 including salary, a terminable allowance and a penological factor allowance; those registered at the Masters level can earn up to \$90,826.00. Annual membership fees to regulatory bodies are also paid.
