Responsibilities/Duties:

The Edmonton Operational Stress Injury Clinic (EOSIC) is part of a national network of clinics responsible for providing specialized mental health assessment and treatment to individuals and their families referred by Veterans Affairs Canada, The Royal Canadian Mounted Police and the Department of National Defense. Individuals referred to the clinic are experiencing work related psychological stress and/or trauma, (e.g. PTSD, depression, anxiety, addiction). Services at the EOSIC are provided by an interdisciplinary team consisting of psychiatry, psychology, psychiatric nursing and clinical social work. The EOSIC provides services to clients in a geographic area that may require travel to locations outside of greater Edmonton.

The Psychologist provides specialized mental health assessment, evidence informed treatment, care coordination, and consultation to clients and their families. The Psychologist will address a variety of presenting difficulties, diagnoses and life situations of individuals, couples and their families through individual and group therapy. Collaboration with other service providers and stakeholders is required. Clinical work is supported by a Clinical Lead to ensure an evidence informed approach to treatment and clinical outcomes based on national network guidelines. The Psychologist actively participates in the measurement and monitoring of clinical and program outcomes.

Qualifications:

- Minimum of a Masters Degree in Psychology from an accredited university is required.
- Registration with the College of Alberta Psychologists (CAP) is required, full registration preferred.
- Minimum of five years of relevant clinical experience (excluding practicum placements) with psychological assessment and treatment in the mental health field is required.
- Specialized training and experience in trauma assessment and treatment is preferred.
- The candidate must be able to work independently as well as within a collaborative interdisciplinary
 care team. Demonstrated ability to use cognitive behavioral treatment modalities is required.
 Preference will be given to candidates who have demonstrated competence in delivering treatment in
 at least one other modality and practice area, e.g., addiction, chronic pain, couples therapy, family
 therapy.
- Current BCLS-HCP certification is required.
