Section Executive

The 2009-2010 Executive Committee consisted of Mark Lau (Past-Chair), Patricia Furer (Chair), Peter Bieling (Chair-Elect), Margo Watt (Secretary-Treasurer), Liz Nilsen (Member-at-Large), and Jessica Dere (Student Representative). The Executive met in person during the 2010 convention, held a full-day meeting in Toronto in January 2011, and held teleconferences in the fall of 2010 and spring of 2011. We also maintained regular e-mail contact.

<u>Membership</u>

As of April 18, 2011, the Section had a membership of 929, including 319 student affiliates. Our present membership is comparable to last year.

2011 Convention Activities

- Pre-convention Workshop: Navigating Therapeutic Routes: One Client, Three Evidence-Based Approaches to Recovery. Presenters: Drs. Randi McCabe, Jeanne Watson, and Paula Ravitz. Cosponsored with the Counselling Section.
- Pre-convention Workshop: Advocating for the Science and Practice of Psychology: The How, What, When, Where and Whys presented by a roster of speakers including experts in government relations. Co-sponsored with the Canadian Psychological Association.
- CPA Invited Speaker (Category 2):
 - Exercise for Mood and Anxiety Disorders presented by Dr. Jasper Smits, Southern Methodist University. He will also be presenting a free public lecture entitled Exercise for Mood and Anxiety: Proven Strategies for Overcoming Depression and Enhancing Well-Being. Dr. Smits' presentations are Co-sponsored with CPA, the Sections of Counselling Psychology, Health Psychology and Sport and Exercise.
- 267 clinical conference submissions this year, including 19 workshops and symposia, and 248 poster submissions.
