## **CAMIMH Applauds Historic Amendment to the Canada Health Act**

**OTTAWA, October 11, 2024** — On World Mental Health Day, Member of Parliament, Gord Johns (Courtenay-Alberni) rose in the House of Commons and tabled Bill C-414 *An Act to Amend the Canada Health Act (mental, addictions and substance use health services).* This signals a significant step in the modernization of the *Canada Health Act*, enacted in 1984. If passed, this Bill will provide the people of Canada access to a wider array of publicly funded supports for mental health and substance use health in their communities.

"CAMIMH would like to thank Member of Parliament, Johns for his leadership in tabling this historic Bill," said Florence Budden, CAMIMH Co-Chair, "CAMIHM has insisted for several years that Canada create the legislative framework to fully integrate expanded access to publicly funded mental health and substance use health care services from coast-to-coast-to-coast."

"Mental health and substance use health *is* health and must be equally valued along with our physical health," said Anthony Esposti, CAMIMH Co-Chair. "We know that mental health and substance use health touches every Canadian, either themselves, loved ones or members of their community are seeking support and we call on each national political party to put <u>all</u> health care needs of the people of Canada first and support this crucial amendment to the *Canada Health Act*.

There can be no health without mental health and substance use health.

CAMIMH stands ready to work with all Parliamentarians to support the swift passage of Bill C-414.
