Committee's Mandate:

The goal of the Committee is to foster interactions between psychologists in Canada and their colleagues abroad, to promote an international perspective within Canadian psychology, and to actively encourage the use of psychological knowledge internationally.

The CPA is recognized by the National Research Council of Canada as the partner organization responsible for representing the discipline at the international level of scientific unions. This responsibility is enacted through a subgroup in the IRC, known as the Canadian National Panel for the International Union of Psychological Science (IUPsyS), which is responsible for administering Canada's participation in IUPsyS. Dr. Saba Safar is the current Head of the CNP/IUPsyS.
