FLIGHT INFORMATION AND TRANSPORTATION

To Downtown Montréal

Montréal–Trudeau International Airport

Welcome to Montréal–Trudeau International Airport! Conveniently located in the city's west end, the airport is approximately 20 km from downtown Montréal. Travel time to the downtown core typically ranges from 20 to 30 minutes, depending on traffic. Within half an hour of arrival, you can be checking into your hotel and beginning your Montréal experience.

Car Rentals

For those wishing to explore Montréal and the surrounding region, several major car rental companies operate directly from the airport's ground level. It is advisable to book your vehicle in advance, particularly during peak travel periods (May through September). Montréal also offers car-sharing options, such as Communauto and TURO, which provide flexible short-term rentals throughout the city.

Public Transportation

The STM (Société de transport de Montréal) offers an efficient and affordable public transit option between the airport and downtown via the 747 Express Bus. This service operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, connecting Montréal–Trudeau Airport with major downtown destinations, including Gare d'autocars de Montréal (the central bus terminal) and key metro stations. Tickets can be purchased from vending machines inside the terminal or directly from the driver (exact change required).

Taxis and Ridesharing

Taxis are available outside the Arrivals area at Montréal–Trudeau Airport. Flat rates apply for travel to downtown Montréal, currently set at \$41 CAD (subject to change). The trip typically takes about 25 minutes.

In addition, ridesharing services such as Uber and Lyft operate from designated pick-up zones at the airport, providing a convenient alternative to traditional taxis.

Accessible Transportation

Accessible taxi services are available upon request at the airport. Montréal's STM paratransit service also accommodates travellers with mobility needs; it is recommended to arrange transportation at least 24 hours in advance.

IMPORTANT

Make airline travel easy and ensure you have a valid passport. Students who are citizens or permanent residents of other countries must have a valid passport and/or a valid visitor's visa. Hotel Parking

The Westin Montréal offers on-site indoor parking for hotel guests, with both self-parking and valet options available.

Self-parking: Approximately \$30–\$35 CAD per day (with in-and-out privileges for registered guests).

Valet parking: Approximately \$45–\$50 CAD per day.

Parking availability may vary, so it is recommended that guests confirm rates and options with the hotel prior to arrival.

Nearby Parking Options

Several public parking facilities are located within a short walking distance of the Westin Montréal, including:

Place d'Armes Parking Garage (705 Rue Saint-Jacques)

Quartier International Parking (1025 Rue de Bleury)

Palais des congrès de Montréal Parking (201 Av. Viger Ouest – directly connected to the convention centre)

These facilities offer both hourly and daily rates, typically ranging from \$20–\$35 CAD per day, depending on duration and event periods.

Street Parking

Limited metered street parking is available in the vicinity of the hotel. Standard Montréal parking regulations apply, and signage should be carefully reviewed, as restrictions vary by day and time. Payment is accepted via the P\$ Montréal mobile app or at nearby pay stations.



WHERE TO STAY IN MONTRÉAL

Convention Hotel

For each convention, the CPA makes a commitment to its host city and respective hotel community, to secure a block of hotel rooms at competitive prices. The CPA is bound to fill these rooms, and respectfully asks delegates requiring a hotel room to book their room through the CPA-arranged block.

Register Early!

We suggest that all delegates, particularly students, take advantage of the opportunity to register for the CPA's Annual National Convention in advance; and if you are not a member or affiliate of the CPA, we also suggest that you join the CPA to take advantage of the significantly decreased Convention registration rates for members and student affiliates.

Where to Start?

You can begin preparing for the Convention by visiting the [CPA's Convention webpages](#) and browsing the Convention program when available online.

Do not be overwhelmed by the size of the Convention!

Although there are many sessions, activities, and events taking place, with a little patience, you can tailor your Convention experiences to your specific interests. Waiting until you arrive in Montréal to decide your schedule may increase your stress level. It is often helpful to know where you want to be each day in advance. Having a specific schedule in mind will also allow you to plan transportation and logistics ahead of time – consider using the CPA's online scheduler to plan your days.

You will be able to access the CPA's Convention program through PDFs on the CPA's website, the CPA's online Convention scheduler, or the CPA's Convention App. The free CPA Convention

App is available for Convention registrants and provides a convenient way to navigate the CPA Convention. Visit the Convention website for information on how to download the CPA2026 Convention Mobile App.

The CPA's Mobile App can be accessed from any smartphone with a browser.

In fact, the combined total cost for Student Affiliate Membership for one year AND Early Bird Student Convention Registration (\$235.00 + tax) is cheaper than registering solely for the convention as a student non-affiliate (\$285.00 + tax)!

Travel Awards

Many of the CPA's Sections offer travel awards including the Student Section, to their members. For more information on what is available, please visit [section awards for students](#).

Many external funding opportunities, including scholarships and other travel awards, are posted on listservs prior to the Convention. Consider checking with your Department or internship site to see if they have funds for professional development. You may also want to check with your Supervisor or other university offices (e.g., Research Office, Graduate School, Vice President, or President) regarding possible funding. Many universities will reimburse some travel expenses for presenting at professional conferences, provided that you apply in advance and adhere to their guidelines.



Book Early

Booking early is a great way to keep travel costs down and to ensure that you get a hotel room at a reasonable rate. Many airlines and hotels offer lower rates if you book your travel well in advance.

For each Convention, booking your stay at the conference hotel allows the CPA to keep overall Convention costs down, and pass these savings on to our participants. The CPA guarantees a minimum number of bedroom bookings to the hotel and rooms booked outside our block put us at risk of paying a penalty. We appreciate your help by booking in the official Convention room block.

Your CPA membership also makes you eligible for certain discounts on things like rental cars. Login to the CPA's **Members Only Site** for information on the various travel discounts offered by the CPA's various preferred vendors and check your registration confirmation for specific air travel discount codes.

Find a Roommate

Share the cost of a hotel room with someone else attending the Convention. Check the [Student Section Facebook page](#) to find a roommate and/or coordinate plans with other students.

Find Free Food!

Many programs and social events provide food and beverages (e.g., Welcome Reception, CPA's Annual General Meeting, First Time Attendees Reception, Student Social Event). However, please remember that "dine-and-dash" is never appropriate. Enjoy the food but be sure to participate in the program or social event as well. Also note that for some events, such as Committee meetings, food is only available prior to the start of the discussion so as not to disturb the speakers.

Networking

The CPA's Convention makes networking easy! Whether specific to a specialized area of psychology or from a more general perspective, you will be able to meet and re-connect with psychologists and students from across the country via various planned sessions and social activities. Whenever presented with the opportunity, whether at a poster session or in a session, don't hesitate to introduce yourself and meet someone! Try to leave the Convention having met at least five new students and at least three psychologists! Consider planning how you will introduce yourself to ensure a great first impression. Keep it simple and start off by providing your name and asking for theirs. Then offer some insight about yourself (such as what you are studying or why you decided to approach them) or follow up with a question about them.

"Do you have a business card?", "Are you on LinkedIn?" Chances are you will be asked these on more than one occasion during the Convention. Whether your goal is to get in as much networking as possible, to connect with other students or professionals who share a specific interest, or if you should just happen to make a new professional contact, having a way for someone to follow up with you (or you with them) is a must have for the Convention. Consider a physical business card, an electronic business card, and/or creating a LinkedIn profile.

What Do I Bring?

In June, the average daytime temperature in Montréal is around 22°C (72°F), with average lows of 14°C (57°F) in the evenings. Weather can be warm during the day but slightly cooler at night, so it is advisable to bring a light jacket or sweater.

Hotels and conference venues are often air-conditioned, so having a sweater or light layer on hand will help keep you comfortable indoors.

Business casual attire is recommended for Convention days. Since you will be networking during both programming sessions and social events, it is best to present a professional appearance while remaining comfortable for a full day of activities.

Checklist of essential items to pack:

- Money (credit card, cash etc.) and identification (including your passport)
- Airline tickets
- Hotel reservation information/confirmation
- Your phone and charger
- Physical or E-Business cards with your contact information (for networking)
- Your presentation materials (posters, slides, etc.)
- Convention schedule
- Note-taking supplies (paper, pen, tablet, laptop, etc.)
- Other device chargers

Other items to consider:

- Camera (if not planning to use your phone)
- Comfortable shoes (there will be A LOT of walking)
- Professional/business casual attire (3 days of programming)
- Clothes for evening activities (3 nights)
- Athletic clothes and shoes (for use at the hotel gym)
- A light jacket and umbrella



Things to Know for International Student Affiliates

- Ensure your passport is up-to-date and bring it with you to the airport. If you need to apply for or renew your passport, leave enough time.
- While the Convention hotel will have free Wi-Fi access for delegates in the meeting area, your phone plan may not work internationally. Check with your provider to find out about international data plans or additional charges for using talk, text, and data outside of the country. You may also wish to contact Ottawa Tourism for information on local service plans for short-term use.
- Though some businesses may take American dollars, currency exchange is suggested. It is recommended that you exchange your money at a recognized bank or financial institution for the best exchange rates.
- Notify your bank and credit card lenders that you will be traveling internationally. Find out about any foreign transaction fees that your bank or credit card lenders may assess.

ATTENDING CONVENTION SESSIONS

As noted elsewhere in this guide, your Sections of interest will most likely have their programs and socials listed on their section webpages; the Student Section will offer a specific stream of programming specific to students in psychology; and the CPA itself will offer a general program stream with events of interest to all delegates regardless of subject matter expertise or interest area.

To reiterate, as a Convention delegate, you are welcome to attend all sessions during the Convention, including but not limited to the Opening Ceremony, the Awards ceremony, all presentations, all poster sessions, any section business meeting of interest to you, and the Annual General Meeting (as an affiliate with no voting privileges) – in other words, you can attend almost anything beyond your scheduled session. You are also welcome to attend committee meetings of which you are a member, as well as pre-convention professional development workshops for which you have registered and paid the fee.

Types of Presentations at the Convention

The CPA's Annual National Convention features many different types of sessions/presentations, that we are sure will have something to appeal to everyone!

Regardless of the type of session in which you are presenting, please respect the time allotted for your presentation type so as not to infringe on the time of subsequent presenters and to allow delegates to transition from one room to another.

Note that most meeting rooms are supplied with a laptop, screen, and an LCD projector. MAC laptops will not be available and not supported. Please note that Audio Visual will not be available for the Round Table Conversation sessions or the Snapshot sessions.



RESPECT THE TIME ALLOTTED FOR YOUR PRESENTATION TYPE!

For example, a 12-minute talk starting at 10:00 must end by 10:12 to allow the subsequent presenter to begin on time at 10:15.





Workshops

- **Pre-Convention Professional Development Workshop:** Half-day (3-hour) or full-day (6 hours) sessions offered on the day before the Convention that provide continuing education credits for psychologists (important for those needing to maintain their licensure requirements)³. The costs of registration for a Pre-Convention Professional Development Workshops are over and above one's Convention registration.
- **In-Convention Workshop (85-Minutes):** Workshops, by an individual or a group, are submissions with a clearly defined practical, experiential, or demonstration component presented during the convention and included with one's registration fee. They should be designed for participants to learn new skills or techniques. Some in-convention workshops will count for up to 1 CE credit.

Spoken Individual Presentations

- **Snapshot:** A Snapshot is a 5-minute individual presentation for sharing information in a spoken only format in a succinct manner, creating interest in a project/program, and promoting networking amongst delegates. This format is encouraged for attendees interested in presenting their research as a talk rather than a poster.
- **12-Minute Talks:** Intended for delivering a detailed presentation about a series (more than 2) of empirical studies or a complex program or intervention. This format is reserved for sharing information about a complex issue, series of studies, or an involved program or intervention.
- **Review Sessions (25-Minutes):** Review Sessions are intended for the review of one or more theoretical perspective(s)/methods/analyses or for the synthesis of different theoretical

perspectives/methods/analyses. This type of submission is not for presenting new empirical research. The presenter is normally a senior expert in the area.

- **Round Table Conversation Sessions (25-Minutes):** Conversation sessions are intended for sharing, exploring, and stimulating thoughts and ideas about an issue/topic/case, a program or intervention, or for brainstorming alternative approaches to research, practice, education, and/or policies.

Each Round Table Conversation Session is submitted by a leader who is expected to provide a clear but brief summary (12 minutes maximum) of the core issues, ideas or approaches, interventions, etc. to be shared and explored. In addition, the leader is expected to inspire participants into sharing and engaging with the forum topic (minimum 10 minutes).

A submission for a Round Table Conversation Session must include the following: a statement of the critical issues, ideas or approaches, interventions, etc. to be shared and explored; a statement of why these issues, ideas, etc. are of current interest and appropriate for brainstorming; and a description of methods to be used for encouraging participants to share and engage with the forum topic and with each other.

This type of presentation will be presented in a round table format along with other conversation sessions within the same room. Please note that no audio visual will be provided for this specific type of presentation. If you wish, you can provide a display of your presentation on your own equipment (e.g., iPad/tablet, laptop).

Spoken Group Presentations

- **Panel Discussion (55-Minutes):** Intended for discussion of a specific topic amongst 3–4 panelists who share differing perspectives. It includes a brief introduction and then discussion amongst the panelists and the audience.
- **Symposium (55-Minutes):** Papers are grouped for oral presentation in a thematic session. A symposium is a submission that usually consists of a moderator, plus 3 spoken presentations on the same topic. A symposium may or may not include a discussant. The moderator is responsible for keeping participants on schedule.

Poster Presentations

- **Poster Session:** Research presented via a poster – presenter is available to answer questions. Posters are the most appropriate and efficient method for presenting empirical research. Poster sessions are generally 55-minutes in length and are arranged by section. Posters are presented in person and can also be submitted as pre-recorded voice-over narration for viewing from the CPA's Mobile App.

Virtual Poster

A Virtual Poster is a 5-minute pre-recorded voice-over narration for viewing from the CPA's Mobile App. This is for presenters that only want to pre-record and upload to the virtual platform.



Section Organized Programming

- **Section-Specific Program:** Sessions offered by the CPA's respective Sections, including the Student Section, that are held in the Convention venue. Each Section is entitled to 3 hours in the program that can be put towards the following: an annual business meeting (this is typically done at the Convention); Section Featured Speaker (see below); and a reception.
- **Section-Featured Speaker (55-Minutes):** Highlight a prominent speaker specific to a given Section(s) via an address by one speaker.

Plenary Sessions

- **Presidential Addresses (55-Minutes):** The CPA President and Honorary President give special talks related to important themes in psychology.
- **Plenary Session (55-Minutes):** Highlight prominent speakers and current topics in psychology. No other scientific programming is scheduled against a Plenary Session. The CPA's Convention typically features four plenary speakers. The Opening/Closing Ceremonies and the CPA's Annual General Meetings are also considered Plenary Sessions.

Social Events

- **Social Event:** Attending social events is a great opportunity to learn more about Sections you are interested in, meet people, and network⁴.
- **First Time Attendees Reception on Wednesday, June 3rd:** Reception for first time attendees that provides members of the CPA's Board and Section Chairs to meet first time attendees, welcome them to the Convention, and answer any questions they may have about the Convention or the CPA.
- **Welcoming Ceremony:** Hosted by the CPA, all delegates are invited to attend this reception on the evening of Thursday, June 4th, to connect with peers and colleagues.

Student Section Social

The Student Section hosts a social annually. This is a great opportunity to meet other student affiliates, particularly if you're attending the Convention on your own, and practice these networking skills. One free drink ticket is provided as well as free appetizers (while supplies last). Check the Convention program for information on when and where this year's student social event is taking place. Please remember to bring your CPA Convention name badge to get your beverage ticket!

Student Section Program

The Student Section program is focused on professional development from your graduate training to your professional career – see below for a list of some of the sessions presently scheduled for presentation as part of this year's scientific program organized by the Student Section, as well as other sessions of relevance to psychology students⁵. Be sure to visit the CPA Convention's website, the CPA's online scheduler, the Convention Program, and on-site signage for more information on the entire Student Section Program.

Residency Fair – June 4th

Formerly known as the Internship Fair

- This is an annual program (workshop followed by fair) with seasoned presenters offering information to help you prepare a strong internship application.
- There are opportunities for participants to ask presenters specific questions about the application process.
- Bring a notebook or laptop to take notes.
- Training directors from various residency programs come to provide information on their site and answer questions.
- Training directors are seated at round tables and students are encouraged to come and go to tables as they please.
- The exact training sessions that will be present are not typically known until shortly before the Convention. Attend the event and see if there are training directors with which you would like to speak. If not, roam the room with an open mind, sit in on tables and listen to questions, and hear about different internship settings.
- Ask questions! Find out what sites offer and what they are looking for in applicants.
- Attend the fair even if you are not applying for internship this year! Learning about the process early is important, and you may discover some ways to strengthen your application. It will give you an idea of what to expect when you do apply. You have an opportunity to hear the types of questions other students are asking, and you might find a site you would not have looked at otherwise!

Presenting at the Convention

Students can also win the Best Poster Award for presenting a poster at the CPA's Convention. This award encourages high quality submissions to the Student Section. Each year, one undergraduate and one graduate student is selected by the Student Section Executive based on the following criteria:

- The student must be **first author** of the submission.
- The student must be an **affiliate in good standing** at the time of submission and at the time of award.
- The poster must be **submitted to the Student Section** and not to another Section.
- The student is **not an executive** of the Student Section.

Asking Questions

Best Practice for asking questions during a session

- Unless directed otherwise by the presenter, wait until the presenter(s) asks for questions from the audience. Sessions are usually timed by presenters and questions may disrupt the timing of their presentation.

Best practice for approaching presenters after sessions

- Exit the room so the next session can enter.
- When others are waiting, ask a single question and then allow others to speak.
- If the presenter is busy, ask if they would be willing to speak with you at a later time and ask for appropriate contact information (i.e., phone number or email).



Convention Etiquette

With only 5 or so minutes between sessions, time may be tight to get from one session to another. Try to arrive on time and stay until the end so you do not distract presenters and/or participants as you enter/exit. If you do need to leave early, try to sit close to the exit and depart with minimal disruption. If there are refreshments, please help yourself at the designated time, not during the actual presentation.

What Do I Wear?

A common question we get from new Convention attendees is "What do I wear at the Convention?"

As noted elsewhere in this guide, when attending programming at the Convention, the dress code typically ranges from business-casual to professional attire. Remember, some of the attendees at the Convention are experts in the field of psychology. You may come face-to-face with a professional you want to impress. As such, you will want to appear professional. First impressions matter!

- No jeans. You may be able to get away with a nice pair of khakis but make sure they are pressed and wrinkle-free!
- Blazers/sports jackets are key to dressing up most outfits. It may get warm in the program session so you will want to wear appropriate attire underneath if you need to remove your blazer or sports jacket.
- Dress shirts/blouses.
- Comfortable shoes – You may be walking around between programs or exploring the host city.
- There may also be events occurring in the evening such as the Student Social or the CPA Social. Perhaps you want to experience the nightlife with your peers. As such you may want to bring clothes for these occasions.

And finally, don't forget to bring comfortable clothes for travelling.



STAYING HEALTHY DURING THE CONVENTION

Attending the CPA's Annual National Convention is exciting! It provides students with 3 days of exposure to networking opportunities, personal and professional development activities, and exposure to the most recent research and ideas in psychology. Days are long and action-packed. Travel and busy days usually translate to eating fast food, forgoing your typical exercise and sleep routines, and sharing germs with hundreds of people.

Attending the Convention does not have to mean slacking on self-care, particularly if you are intentional about maintaining your routine health habits.

Keeping Calm: Things to Think About Before the Convention

- Mentally prepare! Go into the conference knowing that you are going to pull some long hours. Sometimes when you have taken the time to prepare your mind, your body follows a little easier.
- Be sure to bring any prescription medications you will require while at the Convention.
- Before you leave for the Convention, organize your school materials as best as possible. Make

a list of what you need to do when you return from the Convention to get back into the swing of school, and make sure this plan gives you at least half a day of relaxation back at home before you dig back in.

- Give yourself some time the night before everything begins. If you can arrive to the Convention early, give yourself a few hours of quiet time, TV time, reading time, or whatever you do to prepare yourself.
- Pack a small meal or snack for when you first arrive. There is nothing worse than arriving in a new place hungry with no idea where to go! Plus, you may be tired and not up for the food hunt.
- Be sure to bring anything with you that will help you to decompress – books, music, or whatever you need to help calm you down at the end of a crazy day.
- Try to plan your Convention schedule before you arrive – make sure it includes down time.
- Upon arrival, pick up your name badge and the Convention program. Please note that you must wear your badge at all times during the Convention hours.

Eating at the Convention

- Be sure to stay hydrated. Carry a reusable water bottle. Choose water over sugary drinks as they can dehydrate you quickly.
- Pack nutrient rich snacks in your carry-on or keep them with you in the car. You will be less likely to buy snacks with less nutrition if you already have snacks prepared.
- Citrus fruits stay fresh for a long time and have plenty of Vitamin C.
- Trail mix will satisfy your sweet tooth and provide you with a healthy portion of protein, fiber, and antioxidants.
- Try to eat at least one serving of fresh fruits and vegetables at every meal. Eating nutrient rich foods will make you feel better and give you more energy.
- Find a grocery store near your hotel and stock up on healthy snacks and meal items or bring some with you. This will give you access to healthy meal alternatives, and it will be cheaper than eating at a restaurant.

Overall Health

- Stand up, stretch, or walk around between sessions. For every hour you sit still, you should move around for at least five minutes. No complaining about how your next talk is all the way across the convention center! Enjoy the walk and get your heart pumping.
- Drink alcohol in moderation. Alcohol dehydrates you, throws off your sleep patterns, and decreases normal liver function so all the food you are digesting isn't metabolized properly and is more likely to be turned into fat.
- Take five to ten minutes before you go to bed to turn off all your screens (computer, iPad, TV) and dim the lights. Practice some deep breathing exercises, or Progressive Muscle Relaxation. All the stimulation from the day can sometimes make it hard to get a good night's sleep, so a brief decompressing period can be beneficial.

Exercise

Your body will undoubtedly feel some level of fatigue from running around the convention and the host city. Despite this, your body may need some additional exercises to engage other muscle groups.

- Schedule a time to exercise. Odds are your hotel will have a gym located somewhere on the premises. Take some time out from your busy Convention schedule and use it!
- If changing and going down to the gym is too time-consuming or intimidating, exercise in your hotel room. It is easy to do a quick routine in the morning when you first get up, right before you go to sleep, or in between any of the sessions during the day! Below is an example of a simple routine you can do each day of the convention.
- Streeeeeetch!!! Being on your feet all day and walking all day can make your body tense and stressed.
- Go for a walk. Taking a few hours from the Convention to be outside (away from fluorescent lights!) and moving will get your blood pumping, help your legs to stretch after all that sitting, and will refresh your mind.


