Aspects of the CPA Code related to Ageism in Psychological Research: Addendum to Invitation to collaborate on the development of Ethical Guidelines for Inclusivity and Non-Discrimination in Psychology¹ Cannie Stark, Ph.D., Member, CPA Committee on Ethics²

For the invitation to collaborate on the development of *Ethical Guidelines for Inclusivity and Non-Discrimination in Psychology*, I went through the entire *Code* to determine which Principles, Values, and Standards are related to *Ageism in Psychological Research*. It may come as a surprise just how many Standards are related, directly or indirectly, to this ethical issue (N =**83**). The results of this exercise are displayed in Table 1, below.

When engaged in an exercise like this, you cannot help but become intimately engaged with our *Code* and to realise just how complex ethical issues are. This exercise, using different ethical issues could therefore make an excellent assignment in a graduate course in Ethics.
