**COORDINATOR'S MESSAGE**

It is almost time for CPA and our annual Institute. I look forward to seeing you all there.

This year the SWAP symposium will be on the **Unique Place of Fiction and Literacy Journals in Women's Lives**. Thanks to a Canada Council Arts grant, we are bringing Canadian novelist **Katherine Govier**, author of Before and After, Between Men, Fables of Brunswick Avenue, and Random Descent. She will read selections from her work and discuss the interplay between journals and fiction. Joining her will be **Marlene Kadar**, literacy critic, writer, and teacher of life writing. She will also read from her work and discuss topics such as women's desire to confess her sins as an urge to narrate and tell her story in a social milieu that has channeled women out of the acceptable literacy stream and into private, personal, confessional or "illegitimate" writing.

The time for the symposium has changed. It will be held **Saturday, June 2nd in the morning: 10 a.m. in Provinces I**. The business meeting will be held from 9-10 the same morning.

As SWAP coordinator, I thought it was crucial to respond to the shocking events of December 6, 1989 when 14 women were murdered by one man, who shouted, "You're all a bunch of feminists and I hate feminists" as he entered classroom 303 at the Université de Montréal, shotgun in hand. So, with the administrative help of **Mary Ahearn**, the financial assistance of **John Arnett**, chair of the Applied Division, and the cooperation of the participants, I have organized a symposium entitled, **The Montreal Massacre: An Overview**.

Participants include **Margaret Kiely** of the Université de Montréal, who will speak about **Grief, bereavement and the response of the university community** to the massacres; **Peter Jaffe**, Director of the London Family Court Clinic and author of Children of Battered Women (with Wolfe and Wilson), who will address the topic of **Hidden victims: The effects of witnessing violence**; anthropologist **Elliot Leyton**, who will talk about **The mass murderer**; and **Julie Brickman**, SWAP Coordinator, who will present, **Why women? Perspectives from violated women**.

The **Montreal Massacre** symposium is scheduled **Friday, June 1st** from 2-3:30 in the **Confederation Ballroom**. **Simultaneous translation** will be available.

Overall, it has been a good year for SWAP events. As I mentioned in my last message, **Paula Caplan** will give an invited address on the topic of **Don't Blame Mothers**, the title of her latest book.

Also, another invited speaker suggested by SWAP will be coming: **Mr. Rix Rogers** **Special Advisor to the Minister of Health and Welfare on Child Sexual Abuse**.

To learn about the topic, Mr. Rogers spent two years crisscrossing the country and consulted with some 1200 experts in order to formulate his views and recommendations. I think his talk will be well worth attending.

One last reminder: Board elections will be coming up soon and after a somewhat intensive telephone search, we found three highly competent SWAP members who were willing to run, so look for their names on the ballot. Also, if any of you are interested in becoming more active in SWAP or in CPA, let people know. We are always looking for volunteers. Currently, we need a Regional Representative for Manitoba.

See you in Ottawa.

## NEWS FROM THE CPA COMMITTEE ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN

### **EPPP Item Writing Workshop - Focus of Women's Issues**

The Professional Examination Service in New York is contracted by the American Association of State Psychology Boards to develop the written Examination for Professional Practice of Psychology. Workshops in different parts of the country are used to develop a large pool of items or questions which can be used to test the knowledge of applicants in various areas of psychology. The same standardized test is used across most North American jurisdictions each October and April as one of the entrance requirements to become a licensed psychologist.

Under the sponsorship of CPA and the Committee on the Status of Women, the Professional Examination Service is holding an Item Writing Workshop for Canadian psychologists interested in women's issues on Tuesday, May 29, 1990 in the Manitoba Room, Westin Hotel, Ottawa, all day. This is the day immediately before the 1990 SWAP pre-convention Institute. Three dozen names of potential participants from across Canada have been sent to the Professional Examination Service. They send out individual invitations and pre-workshop materials. The workshop should be a great success.

### **Guidelines for Career Counselling of Girls and Women**

These Guidelines, which were published in the last issue of the Newsletter, were endorsed by the CPA Board of Directors on February 10, 1990 on the recommendation of the Committee on the Status of Women. This endorsement offers support and encouragement to governments in removing inequalities of opportunity based on gender.

### **How to Tell If Your Therapist is Sexist**

These CPA approved consumer guidelines were published in the last issue of the Newsletter. Copies are available from the CPA Office. **The following changes should be noted:**

**Number 4 should read:** "Does your therapist/counsellor believe that a woman can reach her full potential only through marriage and motherhood?"

### **The comment on scoring "Yes" and "No" responses should read:**

"If you have answered "yes" to any of items 1, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 13, 14, 15, 16 or 17, or "no" to any items 2, 3, 6, 7, 11, 12 or 18, your therapist may have acted in a manner that could be considered sexist, irresponsible and/or unethical."

## **WOMEN'S ISSUES NETWORK—SOCIAL SCIENCE FEDERATION OF CANADA**

The General Assembly of the SSFC has approved the creation of a Women's Issues Network and a vice-presidency responsible for women's issues. CPA is represented, on the network, by Dr. Lorna P. Cammaert. The vice-president responsible for women's issues is Carmen Lambert; she may be contacted through electronic mail: INMM@MCGILLB.

What follows are excerpts from Carmen's memo to members of the Women's Issues Network, following their first meeting. She discusses several issues dealt with at this meeting, as well as several initiatives taken following the December and February meetings of the SSFC Executive Committee and other relevant information. The second Network meeting will be held in Ottawa in the fall.

### **Associations - role and participation of women**

At the first meeting it was agreed that there is a need to assess the role and participation of women in the various associations. We are presently preparing a questionnaire which will be sent to all presidents of associations with a copy to the representative on the Network. The results will be reported annually.

### **Feminist publications**

As suggested, I am presently compiling a list of scholarly journals that publish feminist research. I would greatly appreciate it if you could inform me of any such Canadian or foreign journals in your discipline or areas of research and provide me with any additional information. I should add that this list could eventually be widely disseminated through the associations and universities and could also be published. What type of information should such a publication provide?

### **Research grants**

A number of federal and provincial government agencies administer research programmes in which feminist research could be considered eligible. I am counting on your cooperation to help prepare a list of such agencies and to keep it up to date.

### **The Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council**

#### **1. Definition of the new scholars (Research Grants Programme)**

Our recommendations, made through Caroline Andrew, with regards to the definition of young scholars have been well received as indicated in Paule Leduc's letter. The Council has eliminated the distinction between new researchers and re-emerging researchers to create only one category: new scholars. The definition has been widened to include:

- those who have obtained their highest diploma in the last five years and who have never received a research grant from SSHRC as principal researcher;
- candidates holding, for less than five years, a teaching position leading to tenure in a university;
- those who, while having held a university teaching position, have never held a position leading to tenure;
- those who have interrupted their career for family considerations or whose careers have slowed down for these same reasons.

## 2. Sexism in research

The Council plans to produce a new edition of the brochure entitled **On the Treatment of the Sexes in Research** (Margrit Eichler and Jeanne Lapointe) in April 1990. The Council will continue its policy of sending the brochure to external readers with the research project and encouraging them to take into consideration the guidelines to ensure that sexism is avoided in the research process.

## 3. Adjudication Committee for Feminist Research

The Council has recently established a new adjudication committee for the evaluation of multidisciplinary research. Many feminist research projects will likely be sent to this new committee.

## 4. Adjudication Committee for Feminist Research

The issue of establishing an adjudication committee for feminist research was briefly discussed at our meeting in September. If you wish to make a recommendation to SSHRC for the establishment of such a committee, you will be required to submit a brief showing the necessity for such a committee and more generally, the necessity for supporting more directly or substantially, research by women on women. It will probably be difficult to convince the Council of the need to establish another committee given the financial resources and given the fact that a new interdisciplinary committee has recently been set up. It may be better at this point in time to use this new committee and attempt to define, with Council, criteria which will take into account the interests of feminist research.

## 5. Membership on the adjudication committees of the Research Grants Programme

The Council will soon have computer lists of external reviewers and committee members and these lists will be made available. In its annual reports, the Council gives the list of members of the adjudication committees. Paule Leduc assured us at the last SSFC Board of Directors' meeting, that she is counting on the associations for input and comments concerning possible reviewers and membership on committees. Constant efforts are made to ensure that a significant number of women participate in these committees. As Paule Leduc explained, each and every association has a responsibility in this regard.

## Federal Contracts Programme

Please be informed that Employment and Immigration have recently released their annual report (1989) dealing with employment equity. The report shows that

the position of women has only slightly improved.

#### **CAUT**

The Canadian Association of University Teachers has requested the support of the SSFC with regards to a proposal it wished to make to government following the tragedy at l'École Polytechnique in Montréal: "that SSHRC receive new funding to establish and administer a "Network of Centres of Excellence" in the area of "all violence within the family and against women." The issue was discussed at the recent SSFC meetings in February and it was resolved that the Federation should maintain its policy of not favouring a particular project or theme. The Federation must remain neutral if it hopes to continue to represent the various associations and disciplines which have varying research needs.

#### **Learned Societies Conference, Queen's University, 1991**

Following recent sexist activities on the Queen's University campus, the Canadian Association of Schools of Social Work recommended that the Learned Societies Conference not be held on that campus in 1991 unless the University agrees to take significant action against this sexism. The President of Queen's, David Smith, responded to the CASSW letter dated December 22 to explain his university's policies implemented since November 1989 to counter sexism and to better protect women on campus. Finally, the Association of Women Teaching at Queen's, in a letter signed by Mary E. Morton, supported the president's position and suggested a more positive approach to fight sexism on all campuses. It was suggested that the Canadian Association of Schools of Social Work adopt the theme "Women in Universities" as a central theme of its conference at the Learned Societies in 1991 and that it invite Queen's University to co-sponsor this conference.

Following this suggestion, the Executive Committee of the SSFC presented to the Board of Directors a motion which was adopted unanimously: That the Social Science Federation of Canada encourages all Learned Societies to adopt as a central feature of the 1991 meetings, the theme "Women in Universities."

At our June meeting we will be discussing the issue further, and with regards to the Joint Sessions Programme, the SSFC will be considering the possibility of funding only sessions which will be directly linked to this theme.

#### **SSFC/CFH Aid to Scholarly Publications Programme**

1. A new publications committee has been set up to deal with manuscripts dealing with women's studies. This new committee is made up of one woman in the social sciences and another representing the humanities.
2. At its February meeting, the Executive Committee of the SSFC discussed the possibility of adopting guidelines regarding sexist bias for the evaluation of manuscripts, on the principle that scientific quality requires among other things the absence of sexism. It was decided that a working group would be set up in collaboration with the Canadian Federation for the Humanities. The mandate of this committee would be the following: to develop gender fair and

non-discriminatory guidelines in research and publication. For the social sciences the members of the working group will be Jean-Claude Muller, chairperson of the Publications Committee of the Aid to Scholarly Publications Programme and myself. The Canadian Federation for the Humanities will soon be naming two representatives to the working group. We will be undertaking a wide consultation both on the principle and on the guidelines which could be developed for use by authors and reviewers.

**SSFC - Special session at the Learned Societies Conference, Victoria, 29 May, 1990 - 9:00-12:00.**

I have taken the initiative of organizing, in collaboration with the Women's Studies Association and the Canadian Political Science Association, a session entitled "Toward a New Equality." The objective will be to open up the debate on the position of women within the universities. We will be examining some of the obstacles to equal access such as university structures and institutionalized discrimination. We will also discuss measures which have been taken to enhance women's participation, such as employment equity programmes. The participants in this workshop-session are: Margaret Fulton, Mary Lynn Stewart, Keith Louise Fulton, Michell Pujol, Janice Drakich, Diana Majory, and Francine Descarries. I hope that you will publicize this event.

Since the Federal Contractors Program was implemented, many Canadian universities have committed themselves to the task of creating and implementing employment equity programs within their respective institutions.

As of January 1, 1990, 34 Canadian universities have been declared certified under the Federal Contractors Program. This means that each one of these institutions has submitted an employment equity program, in order to obtain federal government contracts. After submitting an initial report describing their employment equity prospects, universities do not have to submit an annual report in order to indicate the results of their equity programs. However, the federal government may perform a review or, in other words, conduct an investigation to determine whether these institutions have complied with their employment equity programs. These investigations are conducted on a random basis, and each institution must agree to an investigation of this type.

I will now describe for you the status of some universities, subsequent to reviews conducted by the federal government.

Carleton University in Ottawa underwent a review of this type in November 1988. According to the results of this investigation, Carleton University has not complied with its program. A second investigation was conducted in December 1989 and the results have not yet been disclosed.

The University of Manitoba underwent investigation in May 1989. The results of this investigation indicated that this university has not complied with its program. A second review was conducted in October 1989 and the University of Manitoba is still not in compliance with its employment equity program.

Concordia University in Montreal underwent an investigation in October 1989, and was found to be not in compliance with its program. A second review has not yet been conducted.

This situation is identical to the one encountered at the University of Calgary, where an investigation was conducted in July 1989. A second review has not been conducted in the case of this university either.

We can ask ourselves whether universities will eventually conform to their own employment equity programs. This situation does not appear to be very encouraging. However, I am happy to announce that the University of Ottawa is now the only university to have complied with its employment equity program, as indicated by the results of a second investigation conducted in July 1989.

Despite the fact that the majority of the universities which have undergone review are not complying with their employment equity programs, we can nevertheless find 21 Canadian universities which have already obtained contracts under the Federal Contractors Program. What can we deduce from this? The Federal Contractors Program is not, perhaps, the best solution for implementing employment equity programs.
