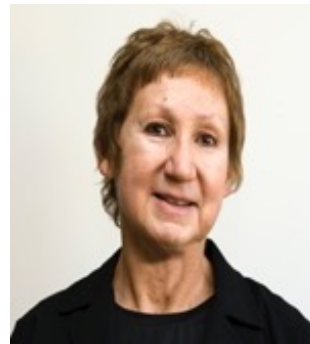

Seniors' mental health teams, programs and individuals can all be nominated. **Priority will be given to nominees in the healthcare, continuing care and not-for-profit sectors.**

The award winner will be recognized at the [CAGP-CCSMH Annual Scientific Meeting in Banff, Alberta](#). The winner will be provided with one complimentary dinner ticket where they will receive their award on October 25 in Banff. A profile on the successful individual(s) and/or team(s) will be included in the CAGP and CCSMH e-newsletter to members following the ASM.

AWARD

In recognition of an individual, team, service or program leading outstanding seniors' mental healthcare and integrative practice models, such as: interprofessional and interdisciplinary collaboration, integration of mental and physical health care, and/or support systems integration/navigation of older adults. Additional domains of activity can also include: exemplary teamwork, outstanding educational initiatives, innovative program development and/or initiatives to build a community of practice in seniors' mental healthcare at a regional, provincial or national level.

Application Requirements

The nominee or team must meet some or all of the qualities outlined below:

- Outstanding interprofessional and interdisciplinary collaboration.
- Integration of mental and physical health care and/or support systems integration/navigation of older adults.
- Exemplary teamwork.
- Outstanding educational initiatives.
- Innovative program development and/or initiatives to build a community of practice in seniors' mental healthcare at a regional, provincial or national level.
- Invocative programming or initiatives to combat ageism and stigma.
- Promotion of the strengths associated with aging and the value of older adults to our society.
- Inclusion (if available) of statements made by older adults or their caregivers who have been positively impacted by the work of the nominee*

*Please note such a statement requires anonymity or written patient consent. To be provided in the nomination submission.

Application

Nominators must be either a member of the CAGP or an Affiliate of the CCSMH. Affiliation with the CCSMH is free – please visit <https://ccsmh.ca/> to join.

The nomination must include the following:

- A written statement by the nominator concerning the merit of the individual's or team's contribution with regards to the above-mentioned qualities in sufficient detail to allow assessment by the awards committee. Please include specific examples of how their work has impacted the field of seniors' mental health.
- Either the nominee's curriculum vitae (if an individual), or a summary of the position held by each team member (if a team is nominated).
- Any supplementary marketing or educational materials produced by the individual or team that would be relevant for consideration (max.3).

Please submit the reference and a 250-500 word abstract of your publication to me.
2. **METHODOLOGICAL REVIEW.** If you have read or written an article using a research method that you think is particularly interesting and/or innovative, or has been used in an innovative fashion (e.g., to access a difficult to access population, administered in a unique way, etc.), please consider writing a review of that article. The goal is to highlight research methodologies that may be useful to members when they are developing new research projects. For example (but not limited to), discourse analysis, conversation analysis, client representative case study, structural equation modeling, a multiple regression conducted in a unique way, mixed methods, etc.
3. **CONFERENCE REVIEWS.** If you have attended a conference since the last Newsletter and there were presentations that you think would be of interest to our members, please consider writing a brief review (250-500 words) of the conference/presentation(s). This includes any presentations that you may have made at a recent conference. Please include the author(s) of the research, the name of the project, the professional affiliation of the author(s), and the name of the conference where this research was presented.
4. **UPCOMING CONFERENCES.** If you are aware of an upcoming conference that you think the other members would like to know about, please email me the details of the conference.
5. **RECENTLY DEFENDED DISSERTATIONS & THESES.** If you have a student or you are student who has recently defended a dissertation or thesis (in the last year), please have the student send me a short abstract (about 200-300 words), the university affiliation and the name of the student's supervisor.
6. **FELLOWSHIPS OR JOB OPPORTUNITIES.** If you are aware of any fellowships or job opportunities that would be of interest to our members, please send me the details of them.
7. **CALL FOR PAPERS/ABSTRACTS.** If you have received a call for papers/abstracts for conferences and/or publications please send me the details.
8. **BOOK REVIEW.** If you have read a book recently that you think would be of interest to SWAP Members, please write a book review (length at your discretion) and send it to me (jenna.cripps@mail.utoronto.ca). Include: Title of the book, author(s), publication date, publisher, and your name.
