



Outstanding Student Representative Profile

The purpose of Student Section's Undergraduate Campus Representative Award of Excellence is to recognize the most outstanding campus representative at the undergraduate and graduate level. The Best Undergraduate Campus Representative Award is presented in the form of a certificate from the CPA's Section for Students after the annual CPA conference. The award is be accompanied by a monetary prize of \$100. It is funded by the Section for Students and one award is be presented each year.

The winner for the 2013-2014 year was Steve Cicione from Concordia University in Quebec. He used his role as CPA Undergraduate Campus Representative to initiate the INPSYCH Workshops, a series of workshops designed to complement in-class instruction by introducing undergraduate students to the tools that drive psychological research, exposing them to Concordia's research facilities, and teaching them valuable career building skills. Psychologists in the Workforce



I have a PhD in Psychology. I'm not a practitioner, an academic or a researcher – what am I and where do I work?

Some of you know me...I'm Dr. Lisa Votta-Bleeker and I am the CPA's Deputy CEO and Science Director. I am honoured to be the first profile in the Student Section's Newsletter highlighting someone who has completed graduate-level degrees in psychology but has chosen a non-traditional career path.

Both my Master's and PhD degrees are in Experimental Psychology; however, my research for both degrees had a clinical focus. I loved clinically-focussed research, but wasn't interested in pursuing a clinical degree. I enjoyed teaching, but it wasn't a passion. I wanted to do research that would influence programs and policies; that meant being creative in my studies and my employment choices.



I completed my PhD studies at Carleton, but did so without a teaching assistantship. Needing to work, I sought out research assistant positions. A psychologist at CHEO took me on, and when I was done with his research, he referred me on to many other psychologists within CHEO; one of them even supervised my oral comprehensives. Through these positions, I supplemented my PhD studies with hands-on training in program evaluation, qualitative analyses, focus group moderation, and systematic reviews – areas for which there weren't courses for me to take at the time.

My PhD thesis work started at the Ottawa Hospital where I was to look at bereavement in women who had suffered a miscarriage. A year into that research, my supervisor got ill and I had to find another supervisor. Quickly into working with my new supervisor, it became apparent that I needed to find another thesis project. At the time I was working at a youth homeless shelter so opted to do my research there; findings from that research led to different intake evaluations at the shelter.

I graduated in 2001 with my PhD and went on to hold some fantastic research positions. I worked as a Research Coordinator at CHEO's injury prevention centre. My understanding of behaviour change, and my skills in project management and program evaluation, allowed me to lead the evaluation of a safe driving program for youth. That job was grant funded and as such, time-limited. I was a focus group moderator for the City of Ottawa and a Research Associate at the Community Health Research Unit through Ottawa U; I supplemented these positions with a post-doc that allowed me to hone my skills in program evaluation and get involved with many research projects which I then turned into publications and grant application experience. I applied for and received a second post-doc through TUTOR-PHC/CIHR in primary health care research. I was encouraged to apply for, and was awarded, a third post-doc; however, at the same time, I had applied for a job as Program Lead at the Canadian Institute for

Health Information (CIHI). I declined the post-doc for the CIHI position where I was the Project Manager for 6 population-heath based reports, three of which had a mental health focus; this position provided me with experience in talking to the media, writing for government, managing staff and budgets, and managing external advisory committees. I was later promoted to the position of Senior Researcher, where I provided methodological guidance on all research matters across the organization.

While presenting at a conference in 2008, I met CPA's CEO, Dr. Karen Cohen, and began working with the CPA in an executive/management capacity in March 2009. This position has allowed me to apply and enhance all of the skills I acquired since graduating – as well as pick up a few more. For example: I have applied for grants, and served as a reviewer for both internal and external grant applications; I have organized summits/forums and made many presentations; I supervise staff, oversee CPA's HR functions and manage various budgets; I create surveys, conduct data analyses and write-up reports for presentation to external stakeholders, CPA staff, and CPA's Board; I sit on or serve as Chair for many committees; I oversee CPA's journals and in this capacity work to highlight psychological research in Canada; and I have met with MPs, presented before the Senate, made submissions to the Government, and regularly meet with representatives from Canada's funding agencies.

Some of you will be successful in finding faculty positions and/or working as a practitioner; some of you, like me, will find research positions. However, some of you won't be able to find a faculty position, may not want one or will not pursue a clinical practice. Whatever your decision, my advice to you is to think outside of the box and supplement your studies as you are able by seeking out experience in program evaluation, public policy, project management, talking to the media and meeting with government officials. Psychology PhDs graduate with a skill set that has value in so many settings and for which there can be numerous job opportunities – seek out and apply for positions based on your skills rather than a position's title.
