The Maples is the designated provincial mental health resource for youth 12-18 years who present with emotional, behavioural, and psychiatric difficulties and is part of the Youth Justice and Forensic Services within the Ministry of Child and Family Development.

The Psychologist role at The Maples is diverse and includes opportunities for assessment and treatment planning; as well as direct treatment provision to youth and families (including empirically supported treatment methods such as skills groups and Functional Family Therapy); consultation to assessment, treatment and community teams; training of graduate students through junior and senior practica; and research and program evaluation. The Maples uses an attachment and trauma-informed lens to help family and community shareholders to better understand the needs of youth, using a collaborative multidisciplinary approach.

**Qualifications for this role include:**

- Licensed Psychologist 6A (PEA);
- Registered, in the process of registration or eligible for registration with the College of Psychologists of British Columbia;
- Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology\*, preferably from a Canadian Psychological Association or American Psychological Association accredited program;
- Specific, supervised, and comprehensive education and training in Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology;
- One (1) year experience in Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology;
- Previous supervised Psychological Assessment experience with Children and Youth and use of current Psychological Assessment instruments;
- Successful completion of a Psychological Pre or Post-Doctoral Internship of 1600 hours in a Child and Youth Mental Health or hospital setting with specialization.
