They will also provide psychological assessments, have an openness to training students and collaborating in research, provide consultation to interdisciplinary colleagues and work under the direction of the Clinical Director.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provides a full-range of psychological services, including psychological assessments, individual and group therapy with children and parents.
- Conducts family-based interventions with parents and significant supporting individuals.

- Collaborates and consults with KIDTHINK mental health and outreach clinicians.
- Participates in the development and delivery of workshops and training for external groups including school and daycare staff, other mental health professionals and parents/caregivers.
- Participates in all aspects of the care continuum and the child's mental health pathway.

- Doctoral degree in Clinical Psychology from a CPA accredited university.
- Registered or eligible for full registration (C. Psych. Cand.) with the Psychological Association of Manitoba.
- Demonstrated experience in clinical assessment, diagnosis and treatment of mental health disorders in children.
