The position will involve graduate teaching and supervision, as well as undergraduate teaching in Quantitative Methods and the successful candidate must be suitable for prompt appointment to the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

Evidence of excellence or promise of excellence in teaching Quantitative Methods will be provided through: the teaching statement; teaching accomplishments and pedagogical innovations including in high priority areas such as experiential education and technology enhanced learning; teaching evaluations; and strong letters of reference. Further, preference will be given to those with demonstrated experience in, or strong potential for, curricular development
