Clinical and School Psychology Instructor - Position # 29511

The Department of Psychology, Faculty of Arts, at the University of Manitoba invites applications for a probationary position at the rank of Instructor I in Clinical and School Psychology. The successful candidate should have a Ph.D. or equivalent doctoral degree in Clinical and/or School Psychology or a related field (e.g., School and Applied Psychology) by the time of appointment, and demonstrate excellence in teaching and practicum supervision. The successful candidate must be registered or eligible for registration with the Psychological Association of Manitoba. Preference will be given to candidates with training and/or professional experience in schools. Responsibilities will include teaching (80%) and service (20%) to the Department, Faculty, and University, with primary teaching activities at the graduate level including required coursework in intellectual and professional skill-domains, and supervision of practica, in the clinical and school psychology (M.A./Ph.D.) programs. Ability to teach introductory undergraduate courses in these areas is highly valued as well. Opportunities for this position to be active in student research supervision exist within the Department's honours undergraduate programs, if desired, as well as to seek internal funding for teaching and learning enhancements and innovations.

The appointment may begin on or after July 1, 2021. The starting salary will reflect the qualifications and experience of the chosen candidate.

The University of Manitoba is strongly committed to equity and diversity within its community and especially welcomes applications from women, racialized persons, Indigenous peoples, persons with disabilities, persons of all sexual and gender identities, and others who may contribute to the further diversification of ideas. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be given priority.
