Candidates should have a strong research record demonstrating excellence, or rising eminence in their field, including a record of high-quality publications, the ability to attract substantial external, peer-reviewed research funding, presentations at major conferences; awards and accolades; and strong recommendations from referees of high standing. The successful candidate will also be expected to be an effective contributor to department, faculty, university and professional service.

Applicants should show excellence or the promise of excellence and a demonstrated commitment in teaching academic and process-oriented clinical skills courses which extend across theoretical approaches and that are part of the requirements for our CPA-accredited clinical psychology curriculum, as well as the supervision of graduate student research and practice in clinical psychology. Evidence of excellence or promise of excellence in teaching will be provided through: the teaching statement; teaching accomplishments and pedagogical innovations including in high priority areas such as experiential education and technology enhanced learning; teaching evaluations; and strong letters of reference. The position will involve undergraduate and graduate teaching and supervision. The successful candidate must be eligible for prompt appointment to the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
