The Department of Clinical Health Psychology (CHP) in the Max Rady College of Medicine, University of Manitoba in collaboration with the Clinical Health Psychology (CHP) Program of the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WRHA) invite applications for a Geographic Full-Time (GFT) Clinical Psychologist (**Position #30297**), with a flexible start date, ideally **August 23, 2021** or as soon as possible after. The position integrates clinical and academic roles (typically 80% - clinical; 20% - applied research/clinical teaching). The successful applicant will be appointed to the Medical Staff of the WRHA and will be appointed to the Department of Clinical Health Psychology, Max Rady College of Medicine, at an academic rank commensurate with experience, typically Assistant Professor.

Based at St. Boniface Hospital, the Clinical Psychologist is part of CHP's regional Adult Assessment Service, providing psychological assessment to adult outpatients, as well as consult and assessment to the mental health inpatient units. The Psychologist also provides consultation, including brief intervention, to the medical units as lead for the site's CHP Liaison Team.

Clinical Health Psychology (CHP) is unique in Canada, being both an academic department in the Max Rady College of Medicine and a clinical program, providing psychological services across a range of hospital and community sites in both urban and rural settings. As a member of CHP, the Psychologist joins a large team of dedicated psychologist colleagues in Winnipeg and across the province who provide clinical consultation and collegial support to the group. Position Responsibilities:

- Psychodiagnostic and cognitive assessment of adult inpatients and outpatients
- Manages the Cognitive and Assessment Psychodiagnostic Service (CAPS; adult outpatient assessment)
- Consultation to adult inpatient medical units, including bedside intervention
- Clinical supervision and training in our CPA-accredited psychology residency program. Teaching of medical students and learners from other health professions
- Development of an active program of applied clinical research

Qualifications:

- Doctoral degree (PhD or PsyD) in Clinical Psychology from a CPA or APA-accredited clinical psychology training program; Completion of a CPA or APA accredited internship/residency.
- Registered or eligible for registration as a Psychologist (CPsych) with the Psychological Association of Manitoba www.cpmb.ca
- Education, training and experience in diagnostic evaluation and cognitive assessment, including the administration and interpretation of standard psychological and neurocognitive tests and measures, with strong differential diagnosis skills
- Education, training and experience with evidence-based psychological interventions for medical presentations and mental health presentations (e.g., depression, sleep disorders, illness adjustment, pain management)
- Education, training and experience with patient populations in mental health settings, as well as in health psychology
- Excellent interpersonal skills, oral and written communication, and inter-professional teamwork skills
- Satisfactory results of pre-employment criminal record, vulnerable person and child and adult abuse registry checks are required

Salary and Benefits:

- Placement on WRHA salary scale will be commensurate with qualifications and experience
- Attractive benefits package is available through the University of Manitoba

- The Geographic Full-Time (GFT) agreement provides the opportunity for on-site private practice
- Supervision will be provided by the CHP Program for individuals registered at the C.Psych. Candidate level, until completion of registration requirements for independent practice as a C.Psych
