

The **Department of Psychology** in the **Faculty of Arts** at the **University of Calgary** invites applications for the **University of Calgary Psychology Clinic Director**. The successful candidate will be appointed as **Instructor or Senior Instructor (Tenure-track, full time)** in the Department of Psychology. The anticipated start date is January 1, 2022.

The Psychology Clinic (UCPC) ([provide hyperlink](#)) is a sliding scale psychological service program serving the greater Calgary area. It offers state-of-the-art training to graduate students of the University of Calgary [Clinical Psychology Program](#), which has been accredited by the Canadian Psychological Association (CPA) since 1995. The Director will have the opportunity to be part of a prolific and diverse research and training environment in the Department of Psychology.

The Clinic Director focuses jointly on ensuring that Clinical Psychology graduate students receive the highest quality clinical training via applied practice and that clients of the clinic receive ethical and effective psychological services. The Director is responsible to plan and provide for clinic and community practicum placements, including seeking new placement opportunities. They provide support and supervision for those working and training within the UCPC, and develop and maintain professional connections at the community, provincial, and national level. The Director helps manage the clinical training infrastructure, including organizing community outreach for recruiting clients and promoting ethical, evidence-based psychological assessment and intervention. The Director may also provide direct supervision of student clinical activities. The Director promotes and supports clinical research being conducted with the Department of Psychology and provides support to students applying for clinical residency.

The Director will teach undergraduate and/or graduate psychology courses in the area of clinical psychology.

The University of Calgary requires that the successful candidate have a PhD in clinical psychology from an CPA or APA-accredited program and be registered or eligible for registration with the College of Alberta Psychologists. Candidates also require a minimum of four years of experience in providing clinical services, including experience in clinical supervision. Candidates will also demonstrate excellence in university-level teaching and/or providing supervision to graduate student clinicians. Experience managing an outpatient clinic is desirable.

The Department of Psychology has a strong research reputation (6th in Canada in Maclean's 2021 rankings) and high standards in teaching. We are actively and fully committed to advancing equity, diversity and inclusion in our department and on our campus, and to adhering to our core values of (1) Discovery and Innovation, (2) Integrity, (3) Equity, Diversity and Inclusion, (4) Community, and (5) Health and Well-Being. Your application attachments should be organized to contain the following (which may require you to merge documents):

1. Cover letter that also includes:
 - a one-page diversity statement outlining the candidate's strengths, experiences and plans for promoting equity, diversity and inclusivity within their team as well as the broader campus community.
 - The name and contact information of three referees, and written permission to the Chair of the Selection Committee to contact the referees for letters of references
2. Curriculum vitae
3. Teaching and supervision statement that outlines teaching, mentorship and/or supervision experience, includes a teaching and supervision philosophy statement (3-page limit), and, if available, sample course outlines and evidence of teaching and supervision effectiveness
