

Assistant Professor of Psychology – Social OR Clinical (Tenure Track)

POSITION OUTLINE:

Applications are invited for a tenure track position in psychology. The successful candidate will have a background in Social OR Clinical psychology and must be able to teach courses in statistics and research methodology, and introductory psychology. In addition, the successful candidate will teach courses related to their area of expertise, including at least one of the following: Social Psychology, Industrial and Organizational Psychology, Psychology of Prejudice, Personality, Abnormal Psychology, Advanced Studies in Clinical Psychology. St. Mary's offers both research and teaching stream appointments. The successful candidate will be appointed to the teaching-service stream, which carries a 4/4 teaching load. Following 3 years on the teaching-service stream, the candidate will have the opportunity to move to the research-teaching-service stream, which carries a 3/3 teaching load.

OUALIFICATIONS:

- A PhD in psychology (must have by date of appointment)
- Previous teaching experience.
- Record of research and publication or strong potential.
