



Ph.D. Psychologist – Temporary Full Time

The Saskatchewan Health Authority has employment opportunities for a Ph.D. Psychologist in Regina, Saskatchewan.

Job Summary:

Under the direction of the Program Manager of the Functional Rehabilitation Program, the Psychologist is responsible for provision of clinical services to clients of the program, including assessment and treatment of clients; supervision of students; as well as consultation to members of an interdisciplinary team.

Qualifications:

Education:

A doctoral degree (e.g., Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology) from a CPA/APA accredited program. Eligibility for (and/or attainment and maintenance of) full registration with the Saskatchewan College of Psychologist, including the APE designation enabling the provision of diagnoses, which is required to meet accreditation standards for third party insurers (e.g., WCB, SGI).

Experience:

Relevant experience or training in a rehabilitation setting is an asset.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Demonstrated clinical assessment and treatment skills in the areas of clinical health psychology, including pain/stress management and rehabilitation. The position requires expertise with assessment, treatment and consultation for psychosocial factors impacting pain and disability. Previous experience working with third party funders as well as tertiary-level rehabilitation clients is preferred. The successful candidate will possess strong communication skills and the ability to collaborate with an interdisciplinary team. There are opportunities to conduct research but this is not a requirement of the position.

External applicants applying to the Saskatchewan Health Authority are required to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19. Proof of Vaccination will be required prior to offer of employment.
