

Limited Term Instructor, Social Psychology, Department of Psychology, Faculty of Arts

The **Faculty of Arts, Department of Psychology** invites applications for an **Instructor** (4year limited term) in the area of **Social Psychology**. The anticipated start date is July 1, 2022.

Teaching expertise in social psychology courses (e.g., intergroup relations, interpersonal relationships, psychology of gender, psychology of morality, and social influence & persuasion) is required. In addition, ability to teach in one or more ancillary areas (introductory psychology, research methods, statistics, human sexuality, or history of psychology) would be an asset. The teaching duties for this position consist of seven undergraduate courses distributed over 2-3 academic semesters. Mentorship of students and service to the department, faculty, and university is also expected. Service may involve the development of courses and involvement in department, campus, and university activities.

The preferred candidate will hold a PhD in Psychology with a background in social psychology. The incumbent will have a demonstrated commitment to undergraduate education at the university level and a record of pedagogical innovation and excellence in undergraduate teaching. University-level training or professional development in pedagogy would be considered an asset. Evidence of experience working with diverse groups and a commitment to supporting equity, diversity, inclusion, and social justice is required.

The Department of Psychology is a research-intensive department with high standards in teaching. We value interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approaches to scholarship and training, and strongly encourage collaboration. For more information about the Department of

- A teaching dossier that includes at minimum a statement of teaching philosophy, two sample course syllabi, evidence of teaching effectiveness/excellence, and a list of courses the applicant would be interested in teaching
- A current curriculum vitae
- A one-page statement identifying the applicant's commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI), plans to incorporate EDI in courses taught, and ability to work with a culturally diverse and international student body
- Names and contact information for 3 referees.
