The Department of Psychology, Faculty of Health, York University (<u>psyc.info.yorku.ca</u>) invites highly qualified candidates to apply for a professorial stream tenure-track appointment in **Clinical Neuroscience & Neuropsychology** at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor, commencing July 1, 2023. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. All York University positions are subject to budgetary approval.

Candidates must hold a Ph.D. in Psychology at the time of appointment from an accredited clinical training program with specialty training in clinical neuropsychology or equivalent post-doctoral training and be eligible for registration as a psychologist in the province of Ontario.

We encourage applications from scientist-practitioners who have an innovative program of research in the area of clinical neuropsychology, with an emphasis on integrating basic and/or clinically-oriented research with clinical practice. The ideal candidate will demonstrate a track record of research excellence, or show promise of excellence, in cutting-edge applications of advanced clinical and neuroscience methods (e.g., neuroimaging-derived markers of brain function and dysfunction, neuroimage-guided interventions, neurostimulation, neurofeedback training, digital assessment tools, development of cutting-edge behavioural assessment and intervention programs) that will intensify interdisciplinary research within the Faculty of Health and beyond. We will consider applicants whose focus is on children, adolescents, and/or adults, but a lifespan orientation to research and clinical activities is desirable.

Candidates must provide evidence of research excellence or promise of research excellence consistent with their disciplinary training and rank as demonstrated through the following: the research statement; a record of publications (or forthcoming publications) with significant journals in the field; presentations at major conferences; awards and accolades; and strong recommendations from referees. Applicants should have a clearly articulated program of research. A strong candidate will show potential for acquiring major external research funding.

This position is a key part of York's strategy to accelerate its progress toward being recognized nationally and internationally as a top comprehensive, research-intensive university. The successful candidate will be eligible for enhanced research support for the first three years of the appointment. They will join the department as a core faculty member in the Clinical Neuropsychology Program, and will be further appointed to one of either parent programs, Clinical Psychology or Clinical-Developmental Psychology, with the possibility of a cross-appointment depending on the expertise and interests of the successful candidate.

A strong candidate will show potential for teaching excellence at the undergraduate and graduate levels, and display excellence or potential for excellence in supervision of graduate student research and clinical activities. Evidence of excellence or promise of excellence in teaching will be provided through: a teaching statement that articulates teaching philosophy and documents teaching accomplishments and pedagogical innovations, including curricular development and in high priority areas such as experiential education and technology

enhanced learning; teaching evaluations; and letters of reference. The successful candidate will be expected to contribute to our Clinical Neuropsychology Program by teaching courses related to neuropsychological theory and practice, as well as by building training capacity in the York University Psychology Clinic. The successful candidate must be eligible for appointment as a Full member of the Faculty of Graduate Studies. Preferred candidates will also demonstrate a commitment to service within the university and the professional community.

York is a leading international teaching and research university, and a driving force for positive change. Empowered by a welcoming and diverse community with a uniquely global perspective, we are preparing our students for their long-term careers and personal success. Together, we can make things right for our communities, our planet, and our future. Our Psychology Department is ranked among the top 100 in the world according to QS World Rankings. Future opportunities for diverse and innovative interdisciplinary research activities will coincide with the newly formed Centre for Integrated and Applied Neuroscience and a new neuropsychology research clinic.
