



Tenure-Track Assistant Professor Position in Adult Clinical Psychology: Clinical Assessment

The University of Windsor's Department of Psychology, in the Faculty Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences invites applications for a tenure-track position, at the rank of Assistant Professor in the field of Adult Clinical Psychology: Clinical Assessment commencing July 1, 2023. This position is subject to final budgetary approval.

In addition to serving a large undergraduate population, the Department of Psychology offers doctoral degrees in Clinical Psychology and Applied Social Psychology. Our CPA-accredited Clinical Psychology Program offers specialized training in three areas: Adult Clinical, Child Clinical, and life-span Clinical Neuropsychology. Candidates will have completed a PhD in clinical psychology and ideally will have graduated from a CPA- or APAaccredited program with pre-doctoral and/or post-doctoral training in adult assessment. Candidates should have expertise in comprehensive adult clinical assessment and be competent to teach and supervise comprehensive adult assessments including at least two of the following: psychodiagnostics, cognitive, learning, psychoeducational, social/emotional functioning, and personality. Preference will be given to candidates who also conduct research in the area of clinical assessment, but other areas of research interests will be considered as well.

Successful candidates will be committed to the scientist-practitioner model. Within their area of research, candidates will demonstrate research productivity, the capacity to develop a strong research program, and attract external research funding. Candidates also will be prepared to teach undergraduate and graduate courses broadly related to their area of expertise; be able to supervise undergraduate and graduate student research, provide clinical training and supervision to graduate students through on-campus practica at our Psychological Services and Research Centre, and contribute to the service and administrative activities of the clinical program, the Department, and the University.

If not presently registered with the College of Psychologists of Ontario (CPO), successful candidates must be eligible for registration and must initiate the process within the first six months of hire. Registration in Ontario is required for all clinical faculty positions in our department. Candidates who do not come from a CPA- or APA-accredited program should demonstrate their capacity for licensure with the CPO.

Application Requirements

- a letter of application, including a statement confirming eligibility to work in Canada;
- a detailed and current curriculum vitae (for CV items listed as "in press" or "accepted," please include official documentation confirming acceptance);
- a one page statement of commitment to Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, and Decolonization (up to 1 page);
- a statement of research Interests;
- up to three (3) samples of published or in-review scholarly articles or papers presented at professional conferences, including (if applicable) clear indications of your contribution to any jointly authored pieces;
- a teaching dossier or portfolio demonstrating potential for or evidence of teaching effectiveness and excellence that will include sample course syllabi/outlines, teaching evaluations, and a statement of teaching philosophy and interests (resources and templates for completing a teaching dossier can be found at https://www.uwindsor.ca/ctl/502/teaching-dossiers);
- official PhD transcripts and certification of degree (copies are acceptable); and
- three (3) current letters of reference forwarded directly by the referees to the Department Head, at the address or email listed below.
