

Assistant Professor (Teaching), School and Applied Child Psychology, Werklund School of Education

The **Werklund School of Education** at the **University of Calgary** invites applications at the tenure-track rank of Assistant Professor (Teaching) with research, professional practice, clinical expertise, and teaching experience in the area of School and Applied Child Psychology. A key element of this position is the provision of clinical supervision and administration of clinic experiences for School and Applied Child Psychology students in the Integrated Services in Education Clinic such as providing oversight, scheduling, and logistics.

The successful candidate will have a background in school and applied child psychology, demonstrated capability in graduate- and undergraduate-level teaching, clinical supervision; previous professional experience in K-12 school settings working with children, youth, and their families; demonstrated capability in teaching in areas of school and applied child psychology including evidence-based consultation and intervention; child and adolescent development, mental health, and disorder; cognitive, social—emotional, and academic assessment; and experience in online and blended teaching.

The appointments will commence February 1, 2023, or at a mutually agreeable date.

Applicants must have a doctoral degree in educational psychology and show evidence of eligibility for registration as a psychologist with the College of Alberta Psychologists, as registration is a requirement for this position. Applicants at the Assistant Professor (Teaching) level must also present evidence of successful teaching and engagement in the scholarship of teaching and learning.
