Duties and Responsibilities:

The Psychologist for the Child, Youth and Family Program provides psychological assessment, diagnostic evaluation and treatment to children and adolescents with psychiatric disorders in the intensive ambulatory, outpatient and in-patient components of the program. The successful candidate will provide direction to the team in areas of program evaluation, research design and consultation to other health care providers. You will participate in professional development and continuing education to maintain competence in your clinical discipline. You will also play an active role in departmental and hospital wide committees.

- Ph.D/ Psy.D. in Psychology with competency in clinical psychology with children, adolescent and families;
- Registration with the College of Psychologists of Ontario (in good standing);
- Extensive child and adolescent mental health background preferably in an acute care hospital setting;
- Proven to have excellent skills in psychological testing and diagnostic evaluation of children and adolescents with psychiatric disorders;
- Previous experience providing clinical supervision;
