

Clinical Psychology (Associate Professor)

The Department of Psychology at Concordia University of Edmonton invites applications for a full-time continuing-appointment at the rank of Associate Professor in Clinical Psychology. The area of specialization is open, though expertise with adults, older adults, health psychology, and/or neuropsychology is desired. Depending on the demonstrated capabilities, experience, and skill set, the successful candidate for this position may assume the role of overseeing the operation of the Psychology Clinic, internship practical, and/or clinical training. **Candidates interested in the position of either Chair of Clinical Training or Professional Practice Leader are strongly encouraged to apply.**

Qualifications:

- PhD or PsyD in clinical psychology or counselling psychology from a CPA- or APA-accredited program.
- CPA-, APA-, and/or APPIC-accredited predoctoral internship/residency.
- Experience as a professor within a Clinical PsyD or PhD program is preferred.
- Registration (or registration eligibility) as a Psychologist in Alberta.
- Experience advising and supervising student research, dissertations, and clinical work; more than five years is preferred.
- Excellence in both research and teaching, or strong potential to develop such excellence.
- A willingness and ability to take on supportive academic administrative duties, including overseeing doctoral student practicum placements.

- Knowledge of CPA-accredited doctoral programs in clinical psychology, with a commitment and ability to advance the quality and content of the PsyD program, courses, initiatives, and student learning experience.
- Demonstrated ability to work collegially as a team member with a variety of teams and stakeholder groups.
- Familiarity with educational and clinical technologies, with an aptitude to learn new software as required, including online web-based psychological testing.

Housed within the Faculty of Arts, the Psychology Department has the largest undergraduate enrollments on campus, an energetic close-knit faculty, and applied psychology emphases throughout. It offers three undergraduate programs and a Doctor of Psychology (PsyD) program in clinical psychology. The PsyD program provides broad and general training in the field and is housed in the Allan Wachowich Centre for Science, Research, and Innovation. This Centre includes a state-of-the-art training clinic, research labs, faculty offices, and many other excellent Centres. The successful applicant will exemplify excellent professional citizenship and act as a role model in the field. They will advise and mentor graduate and undergraduate students, teach and supervise students in PsyD program, and supervise dissertation research. They will demonstrate commitment to, and understanding of, the scholar-practitioner model and participate in ongoing PsyD program development. Additionally, they will demonstrate expertise in their specialty area and engage in ongoing research and scholarship, regularly pursuing external funding.

The normal teaching assignment is 18 hours per academic year. - A teaching portfolio, including a statement on teaching philosophy and teaching preferences;
- A research statement, including two (2) representative publications;
- Recent student evaluations of university teaching (if applicable); and
- A statement describing experience in activities that promote diversity and inclusion, broadly understood, and/or plans to make future contributions.
- **Optional:** a description of experience in managing delivery of psychological services, including the role and responsibilities, service population, complement of professional staff, and referral stakeholders.

- The successful candidate must be able to provide a satisfactory Police Information Check.
