Clinical Health Psychology (CHP), Shared Health is recruiting for a number of full-time permanent doctoral psychologist positions, related to significant government investment to expand psychological care in the health system in Manitoba, Canada.

We offer competitive salary, comprehensive benefits, flexible start date, relocation support, clinical supervision for postdoctoral supervised practice year, ongoing professional development; and opportunity for supervision of psychology residents, clinical teaching, and clinical research through integrated clinical/academic roles.

Clinical Health Psychology is centrally organized under the provincial health authority, Shared Health, and is responsible for psychological services throughout Manitoba. CHP is also an academic department in the Max Rady College of Medicine, University of Manitoba. CHP psychologists are based in hospitals, health centres and primary care clinics, providing clinical care across the lifespan from the very young to the elderly, for a wide range of mental health, developmental, and acute and chronic medical conditions. Psychologists in the Manitoba health system hold medical staff appointments along with our physician colleagues, and enjoy well-established collaborations with medical, nursing and allied health professionals to provide innovative and effective care. CHP psychologists connect regularly with each other, whether based in Winnipeg or in rural or northern health regions, and have a respectful and caring community of professional practice.

Standard Requirements for the positions include:

- Doctoral degree (PhD or PsyD) in Clinical Psychology from a CPA or APA-accredited program; completion of a CPA or APA-accredited predoctoral internship/residency.
- Registered or eligible for registration as a Psychologist (C.Psych.) in Manitoba www.cpmmb.ca
- Training and experience in the specific clinical area is expected, and is required for neuropsychology and forensic positions.

HIGHLIGHTING SOME OF THE AVAILABLE POSITIONS

Winnipeg

Adult- Bariatric Surgery Psychologist

The recently expanded **Centre for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery** offers comprehensive pre-operative evaluation plus post-op follow up that aims to maximize patient long-term success following bariatric surgery. The psychologist will provide pre-surgical readiness assessments, brief pre- and post-surgery psychological intervention, with opportunity for program development and evaluation.

Adult- Pain Psychologist

The **Manitoba Pain Care Program** is a multi-disciplinary, multi-site 'hub-and-spoke' provincial service committed to evidence-based, integrated care for adults with chronic pain. Behavioural pain treatment, delivered through a stepped approach, is at the centre of the newly expanded program's model of care, coordinated with medical interventions. The pain psychologists on the team have an essential role providing assessment, class/group/individual therapies, as well as program development and evaluation.

Child Specialty Assessment – Developmental Disorders Clinic (preschool); FASD Centre (school age) (2 positions)

Based at **Specialized Services for Children and Youth (SSCY)**, the Psychologists are part of interprofessional teams inclusive of developmental pediatricians, nurses, and allied health. The psychologists will provide comprehensive and brief assessment, as well as consultation to the teams and families to improve care and outcomes, with opportunity for clinical program development.

Child Specialty Consult/Intervention – Transgender Health; Child Trauma Clinic (2 positions)

The compassionate, interprofessional teams of pediatricians, nurses, psychologists and allied health staff work with children and families to support transgender health (**GDAAY clinic**- Gender Diversity and Affirming Action for Youth) and to provide clinical intervention for children who have experienced trauma. Based at Health Sciences Centre, the psychologists will provide assessment, treatment, and consultation as well as opportunity for clinical program development in the respective clinics.

Adult Forensic Assessment & Treatment

Based at **Selkirk Mental Health Centre (SMHC)** just outside Winnipeg, the Forensic Psychologist provides assessment and treatment for patients found Not Criminally Responsible on account of mental disorder (NCR) and Unfit to Stand Trial who are under the jurisdiction of Manitoba's Criminal Code Review Board (CCRB). This includes violence risk assessments and annual updates for CCRB disposition hearings. The Psychologist works closely with forensic psychologist colleagues at Health Sciences Centre, and provides consultation to the SMHC multidisciplinary team, to the inpatient staff, and provides individual and group-based treatment for mental health concerns and risk management, with opportunity for clinical programming development. Two of our current forensic psychologists trained in the US; there is excellent cross-border applicability of clinical knowledge and experience.

Adult Community Mental Health – specialized teams F-ACT/ACT; BRaCT

The **(Flexible) Assertive Community Treatment (FACT/ACT)** teams offer wrap-around multidisciplinary care for adults with severe and persistent mental illness to maintain community living. The psychologist is part of the leadership group, and provides consultation to the teams, as well as direct assessment and intervention where indicated. The **Behavior Resource and Consultation Team (BRaCT)** works with care providers and support services to provide behavioral plans for individuals with complex mental health presentations and behaviors of concern. The psychologist provides leadership in the multidisciplinary team for consultation, planning, and capacity building.

Rural/Northern

Lifespan Psychologist (2 positions)

Provision of direct clinical services across the lifespan and maximizing scope of practice through consultation to the teams are the focus of these two positions, one in the **Prairie Mountain** health region based in Dauphin (10 minute drive from beautiful Riding Mountain National Park), and one in the **Northern** health region with option to base in Winnipeg and fly to Thompson. The psychologist works closely with the region's child and adult mental health multidisciplinary teams, providing assessment, treatment, and consultation services, with opportunities for specialized program development such as DBT/ RO-DBT. Team consultation includes a focus on capacity building and provision of evidence-based care. The psychologist also provides leadership in development and evaluation of clinical services.
